## <u>CHAMBER LEADS BINATIONAL DELEGATION TO MEXICO CITY</u> Nearly 90 Cali-Baja business and community leaders advocate for region's cross-border commerce

**SAN DIEGO (April 15, 2016)** –The San Diego Regional Chamber will lead its 11<sup>th</sup> annual California-Mexico Trade Initiative to Mexico City, April 17 – 20. Nearly 90 business leaders and government officials from San Diego and Baja will attend, reinforcing the Chamber's role as a coalition builder, policy advocate, and resource for business on both sides of the border. The trip is key to the Chamber's international advocacy work to enhance cross-border business and showcase the region's global competitiveness.

"The strong, unified voice of San Diego and Baja leaders joining our annual delegation trip to Mexico City speaks volumes for the commitment to collaboration that is making our region a top global competitor," said Jerry Sanders, president and CEO of the San Diego Regional Chamber. "We are creating a unique opportunity for dialogue with the leadership in Mexico City, which is essential for our binational region because the positive impacts of our region's cross-border commerce don't always reach that level."

Delegates will meet with top Mexican government officials and agencies to advance current projects and bring forward new initiatives important to regional growth and business development. Focus areas for the trip include: border infrastructure, renewable energy projects, investment in the telecommunications industry, and cross-border tourism.
